HOUSING

More than 50% of renters 65+ were rent-burdened (paying more than 30% of income for housing) in 2015, up from 43% in 2001

Seniors comprise 20% of general population but only 4% of park users

SHARE OF PEDESTRIAN FATALITIES

People 65 or older were over-represented in pedestrian fatalities in 35 states.

SHARE OF DISASTER FATALITIES

2/3 of North Carolinians who died as a result of Hurricane Florence were 65+





Transportation



Driving shouldn't be the only way to get around. Public transit, ridesharing, bicycling and walking should all be viable options to help live independently and remain mobile.












Outdoor spaces and buildings

Loneliness negatively affects a person's health and sense of wellbeing. Isolation can be combatted by the availability of accessible, affordable, and fun social activities.











Respect and social inclusion



Intergenerational activities are a great way for young and old to learn from one another, honor what each has to offer and, at the same time, feel good about themselves.












Community and health services









Trends in NAFSC

Who serves as the lead organization(s) to coordinate the age-friendly work? Check all that apply.


