Thank you for joining us for the second Miami-Dade Age-Friendly Summit.

Across the globe, people are living longer and our populations are growing older. Miami-Dade has the largest population of older adults in the State of Florida with over half a million older adults age 60+ in the County; and that population is expected to continue to grow to over 900,000 by 2040. By next year, 2020, it is expected that there will be more older adults age 60+ than children 18 and under in our County and that number will continue to grow as our population ages. How well Miami-Dade responds to the aging phenomenon and meets the needs of older adults will depend on how well we prepare our communities to do so, and how we can work collectively toward sustainable change to ensure our community is a place where people of all ages can live with the guality of life that they need and deserve.

Today we'll be discussing how we can make Miami-Dade better - more convenient, more integrated, more accessible, and more enjoyable for older adults and for our citizens of all ages. Together, we will learn strategies for implementation and change from national and community leaders with a focus on actionable steps, particularly focused on our health system, housing, and planning transportation.
